


Mark Stuart: "What IS going on with the weather in Bristol?"

As someone who has been keeping weather records since 1977

Mark has seen the way the weather has changed locally over the last forty years and collected a lot of information about the weather in Bristol over the last few hundred years. He will share some of his findings and give his thoughts on the way the weather is changing.







Is GB2RS relevant today?

First let me start by saying that this is in no way a criticism of that sterling band of volunteers who read the news every Sunday come rain or shine; to you all, a big thank you.

However I believe the question should be asked: is it still relevant today in the 21st century; is it needed?

Looking at the case for doing away with the news service altogether it could be argued that in this age of instant mass communication it just isn't needed. As a rather sweeping generalisation most radio hams have a PC or access to a PC where, if they want to, they can access the news from the RSGB website, thereby doing away with the news readers.

The above case is possible, but I don't think I would really want that. I like to hear the news being read out on a Sunday by a local news reader. Where I think the service could be improved is in the content of the news and the way it's presented.

Do we really have to have all those phone numbers/website/email addresses read out over the air? How many of us actually sit down to listen to the news with pencil & paper handy to jot down an interesting phone number? Why not start the broadcast by saying more detailed information can be obtained from the RSGB website.

Perhaps the news could be localised more, with local roving reporters - all right, that's a fancy name for a local club member sending in a piece about his or her club activity.

It could be a 90 second audio file sent to our clever news readers to edit and include in the next Sunday's news broadcast.

What I'm saying is, let's try and make GB2RS more relevant and more up to date for the 21st century; needless to say all of the above is my own personal opinion and in no way reflects the views of the editor or the RSGB City of Bristol Group.


However, other ideas and other points of view would be very welcome.

RSGB writes to Ofcom (August 19th)

Many UK amateurs will be aware that there have been problems with the new Ofcom licensing system. Following numerous complaints from members, RSGB Board members have been in almost daily contact with Ofcom senior staff. Unfortunately, they continue to receive complaints and the Society has become frustrated at the continued lack of progress. The RSGB Chairman has therefore written to the Chief Executive of Ofcom, highlighting multiple shortcomings in the new Ofcom licensing system, and seeking a meeting at the most senior level to help Ofcom resolve their problems. RSGB will continue to keep the amateur radio community informed of progress.

AMATEUR RADIO Training in Bristol and Bath 2016

Do you know anyone wishing to study for a Foundation or Intermediate exam in the near future?

Bath:

Steve Hartley G0FUW and friends will commence a course in Bath on Wednesday 7th September. Classes will be at the Scout HQ in Grove St (BA2 3BS) 7-9pm for 6 weeks.

The Foundation exam will be at the same site on 19th October.

Cost including book, room hire and exam is £60.

Steve is then running an **Intermediate** course starting on 28th October with the exam in January 2017.

The **10th Bath Buildathon** is being planned for early January to provide students with an opportunity to build their projects and complete any other practical assessments.

Their classes take place on a Friday evening around 1945hrs at the club. There is no schedule as such but courses are run based on the demand and tutor availability.

Currently they are running 3 to 4 courses per year. Full information is available on the club website. They make the point that instruction is given at the pace the candidates require and will only suggest an examination is taken when both parties are confident of a pass.

The shack is regularly on the air for those wanting to gain practical knowledge and operating skills. No charge is made for training but candidates are asked to join the club at £20 per annum. Shirehampton ARC has easy access and plenty of parking space.
