In addition I would remind you of the Bristol 73 Contest January 1st to August 31st, and of the Bristol Activity Award, this latter item being a continuing event.

Your attention is also drawn to GB2BEX at the Bristol 600 Exhibition from the 21st July to 12th August organised by the Shirehampton Amateur Radio club, affiliated to the R.S.G.B.

This station, like GB2GB, counts for double points in the Activity Award and Contest.
