# Last Night in Committee

It was stressed that the local clubs must be made aware of what is happening & to gear themselves up to welcoming new people. The RLO will see to this. The area to be covered will be Avon & Gloucestershire, so the clubs in that area will be advised of these proposals. The RLO is going to arrange a meeting for all club secretaries in his patch to fully inform them of what is afoot. The Bristol group will probably be the main contributors towards the cost of the advert, but hopefully some of the other clubs might contribute something as well as maybe head office.

Dave then left us & the meeting proper began, under matters arising we had received the accounts from GB500JC & these had been filed. The secretary reported the meeting for the Remote Imaging group which the group is sponsoring has been booked.

The correspondence was dealt with in particular that relating to Radiosport was explained & discussed, the feeling was that we were probably hitting our head against a brick wall trying to get free advertising in Radcom, but who knows.

This then brought us on to Longleat, Shaun reported we had received a letter from the Inland Revenue saying we had over paid them to the sum of 13-19p & 01p had been added as interest. The interest would be sent to us separately, it was only a couple of months ago the Revenue said we owed them interest of you've guessed it 13-19p which of course we duly paid. Now they say we've overpaid & they are paying us interest of 01p. Lord only knows how this will get resolved. All aspects were discussed & it was finally agreed to purchase the item,

It now being 10:00pm we closed this somewhat lengthy meeting.

Projects for 95/96 term were discussed as these were seen to raise the clubs profile. During the past 2 years the SARCpod (a packet radio card for the Archimedes computer) had sold well and contributed around £200 profit to the club. This year it was thought a more generic project which may attract more customers should be planned.

The RSGB Bristol Group Xmas Contest has been revamped to increase activity on the bands around the Bristol area over the Xmas period & also to allow members to qualify for the Bristol Activity Award. To qualify for the award stations must score 100 points. Only Postal Districts through BS1-BS21 are valid. Stations may only work Bristol stations once per band on the same mode/location, multiple QSO's using different modes and mobile or portable operations are valid. SWL's may also apply for the award. Scoring is as follows:-

Bristol Stations claim 4 points per QSO on 70cms through to 160m, 5 points using 23-13cms, 25 points + 1 points per kilometre <13cms.

Stations outside Bristol claim 5 points per QSO on 70cms through to 160m, 10 points on other bands. Club Calls and Special Event stations count as 10 points.

The contest starts at 00.00 on 24th December and finishes at 23:59 on 31st December, any mode or band is permitted including the use of repeaters. Stations must exchange their postal code & the number of postal areas worked prior to this QSO. In the event two stations work the same number of postal areas the winner will be determined based on the date/time of the last QSO.

It is requested the above log extract is completed in Band order if multiple bands are used. Logs must be presented by 15/1/96 to any member of the committee who are as follows: G4GTD, G4NAQ, G4NKT, G3ISG, G4EJH or G3TKF. The committee will pass any logs onto Ted Halliday who is the Award Manager for further processing.

A prize of £10 will be presented to the station with the highest number of mentions in the logs, a prize of £25 will be presented to the station with the highest number of points.
