Caption Competition

The picture shows a somewhat younger and less follicly challenged G3TKF in July 1969 with Skylark S 64 on a military base at Salto de Quira, Sardinia. I was working for the European Space Research Organisation (ESRO), the payload being constructed at Filton, Bristol.

Being the junior member of the team it fell to me to do the final tests with the rocket sitting on the launch pad 30minutes or so before firing. I had to activate the sun sensors (for checking the spin rate) with a torch; magnetometers for checking position and alignment by waving a magnet at them (!) and the accelerometers by giving the nose cone a kick and a shake! A whirring commutator sampled all the relevant voltages, and the data stream was transmitted around 450Mhz to the radar station about a mile away. The final arming plug (a 4 pin Jones) was in my pocket to ensure no errant pulses ignited the solid fuel motor that I was standing alongside!

The rocket achieved 280km at apogee and a similar successful experimental firing was achieved a week later.

It all seems a very long time ago now!
