NOAA and the US Air Force had predicted that last week's solar flux index would be in the range 160 to 180, which turned out to be slightly over-optimistic. Geomagnetic conditions were also predicted to be unsettled towards the end of last week due to a recurrent coronal hole, but reality was a little better. This just goes to show how hard it can be to accurately predict solar conditions and events. With the winter solstice just around the corner on **21st December**, now is the time to concentrate on the lower bands, 160m, 80m and 40m. The long hours of darkness offer plenty of opportunity for DX, with much reduced D layer absorption during the day on paths in the Northern Hemisphere as well.

As a long shot, this is the time of the year when the relatively rare winter Sporadic-E events can occur, so check the jet stream positions and the 10m and 6m beacons and you could put some out of season Sporadic-E contacts in the log.
