The "On Air Night" last month was very successful and here is a report from Andy Cowley M1EBV who became Net Control

The net started slightly early at 1859 when G4NKT, Dave called M1EBV, Andy. Ten stations joined the net over the next 20 minutes and we were heard by an eleventh. Andy seemed to hear everyone and was forced to be de facto net controller.

Several of the group experimented with different transmitting antennas or the firing-up of QRO devices with varying results, some better, some worse, in most cases. A considerable amount of aircraft flutter or multipath could be heard occasionally and there was some QSB. Linears seemed to make the expected 6 dB increase in received signals, at least at M1EBV.(100 - 400W = 6dB)

Dave NKT's long wire and dipole and Ron GTD's vertical and dipole had contrary effects for different stations.

It was good to work a rare SSB contact with Cyril G2HDR and another new station for me, Chris G3MGS.

Tom G3OLB in Devon was listening and sent various reports to the group.

The 2011 Buildathon
