"How I started in radio" BFVS member Peter Heaven

After Dave's reminiscence last month my own first effort building a crystal set was similar, with a Brimar GD7 diode, Repanco dual-wave coil (yes, Dave, they made coils) and Dubilier variable capacitor, along with Ivalec headphones (still got them as in the picture); not exactly Hi-Fi!), all

bought from Wireless Electric in St Thomas Street. (Dad was shop manager at Harris and Kingdom - wholesale and retail ironmongers, round the corner in Victoria Street - and he knew the people there, so we got stuff 'Trade'. Those were the days! I went on to build a valve tuner using 90v and grid

bias batteries. I think it had a reaction coil, so probably induced a bit of howling in neighbours' sets as I tuned-in... but we lived in Pilning at the time, and it was a bit of a backwoods even then, so maybe they were still using semaphore. Re TV, Dad's twin bro passed-on his Regentone Big Twelve when he bought a newer one for himself, and so I could watch 'Highway Patrol' and 'I Love Lucy', along with 'Muffin the Mule' and 'Stranger than Fiction' on Children's TV, and then spend happy hours watching the bright spot disappear when we switched it off. Passing cars were a bit of a nuisance, causing interference noise lines to crawl down the screen. Happy days. We subsequently bought a Marconiphone TV with a built-in VHF radio tuner from Wireless Electric for 70 guineas. Trade! I think was a whopping 14" screen, and a very attractive set which lasted for a good time. Then along came colour with it's uncertain reliability, so we rented for a while until they got it sorted.

Latterly I built a three transistor transmitter (audio, none of your Morse stuff!) from a circuit in a book published by an italian-sounding company (Bambini?) and a friend tried it out for me by capacitive coupling it to a long wire aerial. I think we got a reply from a Ham about three miles away, but he had to shut down a bit quick because his wife reminded him his licence had expired! But he was ace at retro-fitting turret tuners to existing tellies.

FJ Cam, eh? Remember Practical Mechanics mag? Wonderful.
