Are you getting large levels of interference on the HF bands ??


This MAY be the answer:

VDSL (Very High Bit Rate Digital Subscriber Line) delivers broadband to over 5 million UK subscribers (January 2016) and is available in over 80% of properties in the UK. It is supplied directly by BT but also by others like Sky broadband, Talk Talk, Plusnet as resellers. VDSL or FTTC (Fibre To The Cabinet) uses fibre-optic for high speed data between the cabinet and the exchange. Equipment in the cabinet then sends data signals over the twisted pair telephone lines to the subscriber's premises. The telephone lines may be underground or overhead or, most likely, a combination of both. Normally problems only occur from overhead distribution.

RSGB has been involved since the earliest days in standards and trials work on VDSL in efforts to protect the HF spectrum. Readers who wish for more background can find the RA document "The compatibility of VDSL and PLT with radio services in the range 1.6 to 30MHz" on the OFCOM archives at:

Ken G3XSJ recently sent me this picture of station G2AYQ a keen QRP operator in Montpelier, Bristol, taken from the Short Wave Magazine in May 1949. Everything appears to be "home brew" apart from a Class D wavemeter.

The station consists of a regenerative CO using a 6V6 running 5watts input. The receiver is an 0-V-2

Ken continues "The call 2AYQ appears in a 1927 call book but was then held by a Mr. H. Stephens. G2AYQ, whose station appears in the photo is Mr. J.E. Bowden who lived at 23 Richmond Road, Montpelier, Bristol. He later moved to Cornwall. Those of a "certain age" may have noticed that Richmond Road is close to Bath Buildings, the site of a business run by R E Pitt.

"Pitts", as it was known, was the first radio shop I visited at a very young age (same for me Ken) It was the nearest Bristol had to Lisle Street with a few offerings of war-surplus gear. On a subsequent visit the sum of 2/6d (12.5p) was handed over for a red spot transistor to build a one transistor radio. It seemed to be full of old guys in sports jackets, smoking, and discussing in great depth what seemed to me very obtuse technical matters. At the time Pitts were in a rather run down area but nowadays, it is a bit of a trendy location. Does anyone else recall visiting Pitts?"

I certainly remember spending many hours browsing in Picton Street - getting Ken Marr (?) to make up metal chassis in their basement workshop and looking at all the BIG transformers and chokes that were down under the shop as well.



While in nostalgic mood

My Grandfather (H.F.Wren) was the first "passenger" on the Staple Hill line on Nov 1st 1888 - the ticket number is 000.

I had forgotten that my brother, who was a really keen train spotter in those days, has the original ticket.
