# RAYNET

Raynet is open to anyone who is interested and who is willing to make an active commitment.

First and foremost you must be ready and available - within reason - to participate in both emergency and User Service events, and be prepared to devote time to training. By their nature emergencies cannot be planned for, but usually you will know when the group is to participate in an event or exercise well in advance. Raynet's role can, at times be crucial to saving life and limb - but it can also be mundane. You may find yourself basking in glorious sunshine in beautiful scenery - but you may find yourself in pouring rain or even snow. In other words, you have to be able to take the rough with the smooth.

Raynet is involved in many different types of operation. While, like any voluntary organisation it needs active, reliable members, you would be free to choose whether or not to take part in any activity. In particular, you would be under no pressure to participate in any activity which might be contrary to your personal beliefs.

Operationally, Raynet is high decentralised, on a county or district level. There are some 200 groups nationally, with some 20 - 30 Raynet members on average, led by their elected Group Controller. Where there is more than one group in a county or Scottish region, a County/Regional Controller will normally have the responsibility for co-ordination and liaison with the User Services. ## THE BRISTOL ACTIVITY AWARD

The Certificate for this Award is a worthwhile addition to any radio shack. It is awarded to any station in any country which logs a sufficient number of contacts with Bristol stations in postal districts BS1 - BS21 inclusive. Short wave listeners may also apply, subject to confirmation by a referee, or through submission of QSL cards. It is not necessary to be a member of the RSGB.

Four points will be gained for each of the contacts made by radio. For the basic One Star Award, a minimum of 100 points are needed, and endorsements can be subsequently obtained for each additional 100 points. An endorsement can be requested for "Worked All Award Area" if contacts are made with all 21 postal districts.

Bristol stations are asked to inform their contacts of the existence of the Award, and to pass on all relevant information, including postal district and points value for the contact and repeat it on their QSL card.

The Award is designed to promote amateur radio activity in the Bristol area. Each Bristol station may be contacted once only on each band but Portable and Mobile operation will be taken as separate from the base station contact, provided that the Bristol station is still operating within the prescribed postal district.

Contact may also be made via repeaters or via satellites. In the case of Special Event Stations, Field Days, or Club Stations within BS1 - BS21, such contacts rate double the usual points allocation.

When 100 (etc) points are known to have been accumulated the log extracts under separate

band headings, must be confirmed by at least one other amateur, and forwarded to the Bristol Activity Award Manager, G3JMY who is QTHR together with the callsign and location of the station. Applications for endorsements will be issued with a new up-dated certificate.

Please note points can be claimed as follows for a contact with a Bristol station:
