Sad news...**Warwick Williams G8CLS** Passed away recently, just after reaching his 90th birthday.

In the early 1950s ,Warwick worked for B A C Engines and was a member of the engine gang working in the Flight sheds on the Bristol helicopters. When the helicopters moved to Weston he went with them, staying for many years. He was deeply involved with engine development on the Belvedere. During the war he served with the R A F and spent time in the Middle East . Warwick was a regular member of the North Bristol club, helping to design and build radios for club members; power supplies and EF80 radios were his speciality. His skills even ran to watch repairing.
