

The October exam was a clean sweep with all nine candidates that sat the exam passing.

Eight had studied with us and one had previously studied with Shirehampton (I believe) but never managed to sit the exam.

Eight of the successful Foundation candidates are now studying for the Intermediate with two sitting both Intermediate and Advanced on 5 December. The rest are heading for an Intermediate exam in January.

The 5th Bath Buildathon is being held on 7th Jan to offer the opportunity to build a superhet receiver.

Not really part of the formal classes but it may be of interest to know that we have been running distance learning courses for the Advanced level and have had nearly **one hundred** students in 2011. 26 sat and passed the June exam, 64 started in July for the December exam and 4 were helped for the October exam. We also had 3 in our classroom classes. The waiting list for the next Distance Learning course is currently 37.
