Last Night in Committee

Concern was again expressed at the illegal selling of satellite cards at Longleat. We must ensure that a disclaimer is put on the paperwork as it was recently noticed at another event there were several traders selling the cards.

Concern was raised at the last meeting re the scoring in the Super Duper software by Derek Germaney. Clive Maby reported that Paul O'Kane the author of Super Duper has confirmed there is little chance of a bug in the scoring of his software as a standard algorithm is used which was not written by Paul. Upgrades to Version 8 of the HF & VHF software were obtained at the HF Convention this month.

The secretary confirmed he had increased the insurance cover to £25,000, and raised the question of what to do with the groups 60ft tower. It was agreed to raise the issue at the next general meeting. Our treasurer gave us the latest financial report, and confirmed that the cheques which had not been presented at the previous meeting were due to a mislaid bank statement.



SSTV - JVFAX Version 7 Part II/III of III

Ed. Following a request from one of our readers I have decided to publish parts II and III of this series on JVFAX.



When JVFAX7 is used for SSTV using the simple interface several things gave problems. The program documentation gives most of the information to sort out the parameters so sorry, you must read that! Here are several problems and cures!

• The program locks up

Usually RF getting in through the leads. I fitted ferrite rings (in close pair) on input/output leads. Also on the HF rig (100 watts out) I screened the lead using metal tape wound along it length but not connected to the microphone plug at the rig end. Eventually after fitting two more ferrite rings next to my interface box that fixed it!

The received pictures are split into strips

This occurs on one edge like a saw tooth pattern. This is caused by the clock in your computer not operating at the correct default frequency set in JVFAX. The solution is change the default, easy! How? Tune to a weather station transmitting WEFAX e.g. 7.878, 4.608 or 14.434 on USB are three common stations. Set your mode to WEFAX and use the M key and tune to get a white picture background with black text lines. Let the picture cover about 6 inches of your monitor and then operate the

skew adjustment using the backslash (the key with the? on). This will put a vertical line onto the screen. Using the left or right arrow cursor keys align the line on your screen with any line that should be vertical on your picture, then press the enter key. This process should now have reset your computers clock frequency to the correct value on the configuration screen. Look on the config screen & make a note of the value! Another way is to set it up with the help of a friend who's on SSTV but be sure his pictures are straight or you will both end up wrong. This process should only ever be required once.

Memory Managers

JVFAX documentation says you cannot use SSTV/FAX/WEFAX if your PC uses a memory manager but I use Qemm with no problems so maybe it all depends on your PC. I am using a 386DX with DOS 6.2, Smartdrive etc. try & see first.

· TX Audio Filter

When you have finished building the audio filters its a good idea to listen to the volume of your transmitted audio and adjust the input to your rig so that the received volume is similar whether receiving Mic audio or SSTV audio, generally the SSTV audio will be a lot higher & will need attenuating. The output of your transceiver should be adjusted to ensure that you do not cause the PA stage a problem WARNING! SSTV IS 100% DUTY CYCLE. My TS850 runs 85 watts happily but they won't all. Look in your rigs handbook & adjust your drive level or start saving!! Don't forget your poor PSU either. I use a linear now.

What frequencies should I listen to?

At this point in the sunspot cycle try 3.730 LSB on 80m (usually a net on Sunday mornings) 14.230 USB on 20m for the DX! 144.500/433.500 on FM seem active locally. Please read the bandplan as SSTV gives a lot of QRM. Its usually quite strong but SSTV also suffers from QRM so try not to annoy others & maybe they might also read the bandplan!

Thumbnail files

It appears some people get problems with thumbnail files in JVFAX. I have heard several times where pictures don't show on the screen but on pressing the enter key a picture comes up as usual. This can be rectified by pressing "D" over the blank & then reloading the picture after "A" key! Apparently some microprocessors do not work too well with the thumbnail feature & if that is the case I suggest you load pictures from the H key procedure & ignore the thumbnail screen, a pity but it can be frustrating!!

I can only receive B&W pictures

This is almost always down to the inability's of the video card & is only often cured by purchasing a new one, but do try all the alternative settings in config, it is cheaper but doesn't always work.

· Funny size pictures on receive

This is caused by having the zoom ratio set to yes.



Part III/III of III

A common problem is "How do I get pictures to transmit using JVFAX?" When I first started I had this problem. My first pictures came off the Packet BBS network downloaded using the YAPP protocol. These were generally OK for the purpose, but obviously not the most unusual pictures as most SSTV stations had seen them.

I thought about this, asked around & finally I spent some pennies, & bought a video digitiser (Videoblaster in fact). I could then digitise pictures from the video camera, convert them to

GIF format and send them. Problem solved? not really I found the resolution was not really good enough for SSTV and the pictures were a bit grainy & dull. The next step was a picture processing program e.g. Neopaint or even the built in JVFAX one brightness up/down. Better but still not really good enough.

I then bought a picture CD ROM & tried some pictures. Aha! a great improvement. Fiddle with the brightness and contrast, add your callsign using a picture program put the picture in JVFAX and transmit. First these CD NO! pictures must be processed by LVIEW or Paintshop Pro & converted to .GIF format (actually Videoblaster can do this also). pictures must then go into JVFAX & be resized using zoom 4/3 ratio to fit the JVFAX screen, then & only then can you transmit them with no problems. Now the end result of all this hassle is I that I can produce personal pictures (family, local views etc. using the digitiser) but the quality pictures come from the CD ROM. could now use my 35mm camera, get the pictures put on Photo CD & use them except for the expense.

The only other answer is a colour scanner. I have traded in my digitiser and gone mad & bought a colour scanner! The results? well generally I find excellent pictures from existing colour photographs are almost as sharp as from a CD ROM, far better than the digitiser & for me this is the best way.

That's about it folks! Finally a shareware program I am trying called PSP (Paintshop Pro) has excellent features for changing graphics modes, have a look!
