Last Night in Committee

The main subject for discussion last night was the groups position regarding tax liability. The Inland Revenue have changed things recently & we are now liable to pay Corporation Tax. To explain all of this Shaun, asked Mike Batt, a former treasurer, to attend our committee meeting to explain it to us & more importantly show us the way through the tax minefield. It was agreed that the best way forward was for Shaun to have an informal meeting with the tax inspector at which we could establish some ground rules for now & for future years which should make the tax situation in future years easier. Shaun will report back in due course & hopefully be able to give us our tax liability to date. Mike Batt then left the meeting.

It was felt more care must be taken next year at Longleat to avoid counterfeit money. Derek Germaney also raised the question of what traders are selling being legal & quoted the example of the TV Satellite cards which didn't work & are illegal anyway. The group doesn't want this sort of trader. It was agreed to increase the insurance on borrowed/hired equipment to £25000 permanently. This will help decrease the insurance costs on the hire of the marquees at Longleat.

The treasurer gave us the latest financial position and confirmed he had closed down the instant account as had been agreed at the previous meeting. He also said he had issued a number of cheques to various people which had not been presented, he will look into this further.

Regarding Longleat, the mailshot to the press had not yet gone out but will soon be done. The donations to the various clubs who had helped at the rally had been dispatched and two thank-you letters have been received.

Under AOB the question of the groups 60ft tower was raised, members will be aware the group bought this tower from BARC with the intention of mounting it on a trailer so it could used by the GB500JC project & others. Unfortunately the cost of the trailer had escalated enormously beyond our control & this was no longer feasible. The tower had been transported to the Marshfield contest site for safe keeping whilst its fate was decided. One proposal put forward was that the contest group should install it permanently at the Marshfield site & we should offer it to our members & various clubs. However it must always be remembered towers are dangerous things & can be lethal to the unwary. It was decided to consult the members before a decision is made. We also decided the group will indemnify people who loan equipment to the group & its sub committee, & if the equipment goes faulty as a result of fair wear & tear, which would not be covered by insurance each such occurrence will he looked at on its merits.

And finally with a little bit of arm twisting Peter Wharton G1PCW agreed to be this years auditor in the absence of anybody else. With the time now being 9:45pm & quite dark outside, isn't it surprising how quickly the nights are drawing in, we closed the meeting.

Equipment Purchase

At Longleat Rally the group purchased a respectable SWR/Power Meter which may be loaned from Tony G4ROX. The meter covers 1.8-160Mhz and is rated up to 1Kw from 1.8-60Mhz & 250w in the 60-160Mhz range.

Why G6YB?

For some time now it has puzzled me why the group was allocated the callsign G6YB. The 'B' could be for Bristol, but why the 'Y', perhaps it could stand for young, i.e.. G6 Young Bristol, presumably some of our members were young once. On the other hand wouldn't it have been nicer if the group could have been allocated G6RB, G6 Radio Bristol.

Talking to Harry Gratton G6GN recently he filled me in on some of the history of the groups callsign G6YB. Originally the group had wanted to use the callsign G6RB, but this was already allocated to Arthur Bartlett, a well known Bristol amateur & regional rep for the RSGB. Apparently Arthur had an outstanding station of the day, & was one of the Empire link stations. If like me you didn't know what this was, get in contact with G6GN & I'm sure he'll be only to happy to explain. For those lucky enough to get an invite to Harry's QTH I can thoroughly recommend the tea & cakes.

Anyway, Arthur Bartlett eventually became a silent key & believe the group made some approaches as to acquiring the G6RB callsign. However the powers that be at that time refused on the grounds that a member of Arthur's family might become interested in amateur radio & want to have the callsign re-issued to them.

I wonder if anyone has any more information on this matter, any papers relating to the G6RB callsign, was it ever re-allocated to a member of the family? Should the group reapply for the callsign, to run alongside our own G6YB, if you have any thoughts on the matter or any information perhaps you will be kind enough to let me know through the columns of the groups newsletter.

There were 416 tables sold inside tents & 52 outside pitches. Space was sold to 164 different traders. 17 Clubs/Societies took table space.




Shirehampton ARC Summer DF Hunts

SSTV - JVFAX Version 7 Part I of III



JVFAX version 7 has been excellent for use with Weather Sat equipment and has given very good results, and still does. So how about SSTV?

I have been active on SSTV using this program for several months now and thought it may be perhaps of interest to type up a few things I have learnt about the setting up and use of JVFAX for SSTV as I found it.


The first problem was how to interface the program to my PC (JVFAX only works on PC's or clones). The Martelec wxfax unit which I already have was useless on SSTV and only just managed to produce low contrast pictures (incorrect filtering suspected). The JVFAX comparator (741 OpAmp) worked but I got some speckles off HF SSTV. On changing to the Hamcomm interface (different resistors and added capacitors) I found some bandwidth problems. So eventually I tried the JVFAX interface but with the capacitors from Hamcomm which produced the best results.

The program generates the SSTV tones at the PC's speaker and this should be put through the simple filter network described in the files that come with the program. A problem happened here to myself and a few friends where I found the if only ONE connection is made between the PC's speaker and the audio filter all works okay. However if both leads are used into the filter network problems may occur! so give some thought to this.

I built my interface into a small box about 75mm * 50mm and fitted two sockets (one to connect my mic lead and one for the appropriate transceiver) using a separate connecting lead for each transceiver. Two switches are also fitted to switch transmit to receive and the other to connect the microphone or the audio tones to the rig as required. This seems a little complicated but isn't really, just draw it out on paper and think it through! The result is that to change transceiver all I do is swap to a different lead, everything else stays in place.

At this time I am using the Martelec interface on the HF bands but you must use the RIT to force the tones into the correct audio range to suite the interface. This can't be done on VHF FM of course so I am using the program Multi-Term from BARTG.
