



### 4M-LXS Lunar ham radio payload

(144Mhz DX NOT 70Mhz!)

Beijing plans to launch a Lunar space-craft on a journey lasting 196 hours that should take it around the Moon before returning and re-entering the Earth's atmosphere. It will carry a 14 kg payload known as **4M-LXS** which was developed at LuxSpace. The launch is expected to take place on October 23, 2014 at 1800 UT.



4M stands for Manfred Memorial Moon Mission in memory of Professor Manfred Fuchs, founder and chairman of OHB group, Bremen who passed away on April 27, 2014.

The 4M-LXS amateur radio payload will transmit on 145.980 MHz  $\pm$  4.9 kHz (-40°C to  $\pm$ 125°C), Doppler max: -2200 Hz,  $\pm$ 1000 Hz.

The continuous transmissions will start 4670s (77.8 minutes) after launch (-0, +600s). Five successive 1 minute sequences are sent during the five minute cycle. The digital mode JT65B will be used; this can be decoded by radio amateurs using the free WJST software; there will also be 'human readable' tone transmissions.

### First 6m Transatlantic Opera decode achieved

At 14.27 on 21 July, WD4KPD decoded the first 6m band transatlantic Opera beacon transmission from Graham, G0NBD, at a range of 3,664 miles.

The transmitting station used Opera mode OP1 with the 60 second transmit time pre-set for the 6m band. The aerial was a home-made 2-element Quad located in the roof space of the house.

### **December is YOTA Month**

December is IARU Region 1 YOTA month and the RSGB has arranged for Clubs/Groups to use the special callsign G14YOTA (and its Regional variations) on a rota basis.

The application process for the use of the special Callsign has now been finalised and the application form is available here. G14YOTA APPLICATION FORM

There are only 31 allocations so applicants are asked to give three choices of date in an attempt to resolve diary conflicts.

There are some conditions attached to using the G14YOTA callsign and these are included on the application form and on the <u>website</u>. The main one is the requirement to use the callsign to put Youngsters On The Air; anyone under the age of 26 is considered to be a youngster. Events might be limited to Club/Group members or you might like to open the doors to Scouting/Guiding/Cadet groups, or you might like to spend a day at your local school/college/university.

Applicants are encouraged to think about making the most of the activation by including other activities, such as Morse demonstrations, ARDF hunts, WSPR beacon displays, listening to remote SDRs, use of Arduino/Raspberry Pi etc. RSGB will provide some promotional material, stickers, badges, etc.

You need to work quickly in sorting out your plans as applications must be submitted by Monday the 22nd of September. A panel made up from the YOTA teams will then allocate the callsign in order to get the final list to Ofcom giving them two months' notice of the first activation. Where there are conflicts in application dates the panel will use the information on the application and the geographical spread of applications to make their allocations; assuming Clubs/Groups apply, every Region will have some activations.
